


Figure 2. Side View of ATH10K1R8B3950K




Figure 3. Part Number Convention of ATH10K1R8B3950K




Figure 4. Resistance Tolerance vs. Temperature




Figure 5. Temperature Tolerance vs. Temperature



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


Figure 6. Resistance Tolerance vs. Temperature
